Mission Statement

The Board of Trustees believes each student should be accepted into the educational program, as he/she is. That he/she should be provided with a stimulating environment and opportunities that will effect continuing satisfactory adjustment to life. Application of this philosophy shall provide environment and opportunities to each student within the bounds of his/her capacity as can be provided by the financial limits of the school district.

Superintendent's Highlights

The Pershing County School District (PCSD) encompasses approximately 6,100 square miles hosting four schools: two elementary, one middle school, and one high school. The school district served 658 students in FY18-19, indicating a slight decrease from 667 students in FY17-18. There are also approximately 200 students in the northeast corner of the county that attend schools in the adjoining district, eliminating an eighty-mile one-way daily trip.

The PCSD developed a District Performance Plan with active implementation for the FY18-19 school year. A major focus of the district is coordination of curriculum with the Nevada Academic Content Standards to provide the best possible outcomes for students with the ultimate goal of ensuring that PCSD students are college and/or career ready upon graduation.

The district maintains one of the lowest student dropout rates in the state while its graduation rate is one of the highest at 96.3 percent for the 2018 class. The k-5 student/teacher ratio in the county is 21:1 and the average class size at secondary level is 19.5. The district special education enrollment is slightly above the statewide average of 12.2%, with 16.3% of the student population receiving special services. Nevertheless, the district provides comprehensive services providing Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) through inclusion setting models, resource-tutorial programs, and a life-skills support classroom for students with severe needs.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1: Ensure implementation of a district wide curriculum that is aligned with state standards to improve academic achievement at all levels for all students.

Objective 1: Teachers will expand their instructional delivery strategies in alignment with state standards to meet the needs of all learners, particularly sub population groups of LEP, IEP, and FRL, as evidenced by increased district-wide accountability assessments, and maintain the high school graduation rate from FY2017 of 100%.

Goal 2: Ensure that a district wide assessment system with multiple types of aligned measures is in place to monitor student growth and hold administrators, teachers, and staff accountable for increased student achievement.

Objective 1: Students, grades 3-10, in the district will increase proficiency target on MAP testing in all areas by 5% from the 17-18 school year, 40.68% overall average.

District Communication Efforts

The district recognizes that all individual school and district performance goals can only be met through the dedicated commitment to student learning by the professionals employed with the district, along with continued support of parent involvement and community backing. The cultural attitude within the school district values education, works to protect and

nurture students, and is positive and productive with a hard-working staff that appreciates tremendous support from parents and community stakeholders. Pershing County School District provides many opportunities for parents to become active in their child's education. Parents are routinely invited to celebrate the successes of their students through academic and extra-curricular award ceremonies, along with other regularly scheduled programs and activities presented district wide. Informational events, such as parent and family nights, are routinely scheduled throughout the year and allow for opportunities to celebrate student achievements and familiarize parents with the staff and curriculum. In the fall of 2018, the annual district-wide, pre-school thru 12th grade family informational night and open house was coordinated using the high school gymnasium. Parents and students spent the evening visiting with teachers, receiving specific class information, and had opportunity to explore college and career opportunities. Periodic breakfasts, such as Donuts with Dad and Muffins with Mom bring the parents to school at elementary level. Communication with parents is on-going and continues to improve through individual open house events held at school sites throughout the year, monthly newsletter mailings, and routine school-home notes. Parent teacher conferences are routinely scheduled at all schools with faculty and are highly encouraged. All schools welcome and appreciate parents and community members that volunteer their time and talents to improve educational and extra-curricular opportunities for students within the district.

Junior and senior parents are invited to attend career and college planning seminars held annually at the high school. Information about district activities, school announcements, and student grades and attendance are available through the district and schools' websites in addition to the student information system website. Periodic surveys are sent to parents in an effort to determine where improvement is needed within the schools and the district. High school, middle school, and elementary school ceremonies are organized and held throughout the year to recognize and celebrate student achievement in academic, athletic, and extra-curricular activities and participation. Quarterly honor roll and perfect attendance lists from all schools are published in the local newspaper along with articles featuring leadership events, classroom happenings, featured field trips and sports highlights, among others.

Family involvement and community support is recognized as the foundation for student success in all district sponsored academic and extra-curricular programs. The district is very fortunate in that the local business groups have always been supportive of school-sponsored endeavors; from athletic programs, to individual group fundraising events, to hosting students in work-study programs and job shadowing opportunities. There are thousands of dollars of scholarship money offered to high school graduates annually by local entities. District counselors work diligently with the community and local businesses to ensure our children have many avenues to explore continuing career opportunities. Student leadership groups district-wide give back to the community through on-going service projects such as fundraising for Relay for Life, initiating food drives, and visiting and volunteering at the Senior Citizen Center, nursing home, and hospital. Student council members lead the student body in numerous service projects throughout the year. The partnership between hard working students, parents, and local businesses, allows for the continuation of these types of projects to be successful.
